

W. Vaughn McCall, MD, MS has been the Case Distinguished University Chair of the Department of Psychiatry and Health Behavior at the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University since 2012. He also serves as Associate Dean for faculty Affairs. He completed his medical degree and post-graduate psychiatric training at Duke University. He completed a Masters degree in Epidemiology from Wake Forest University. He is board certified in general psychiatry, geriatric psychiatry, and sleep medicine. His research interests include depression, electroconvulsive therapy, quality of life, insomnia, and suicide. His research has been continuously supported by the National Institute of Mental Health since 1995, and he is author of more than 450 publications, including more than 190 peer-reviewed journal articles, with an H-index of 36. He is Editor of the Journal of ECT, Past Associate Editor for the Journal of Clinical Sleep Medicine, and on the Editorial Board of Sleep. He has been the Past President of the Association for Convulsive Therapy, and a prior Director of the Board of the American Academy of Sleep Medicine. He previously was the Chair of Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine at Wake Forest University School of Medicine from 2001-2012.
