He is a passionate advocate for diversity enhancement in medicine as a strategy to reduce healthcare disparities. Previously the dean of admissions in the College of Medicine from 2009 to 2019, he led OSU to become one of the most diverse medical schools in the country while keeping the average MCAT score of entering classes at or above the 90th percentile. He speaks widely on healthcare disparities, diversity enhancement in medicine, and implicit bias in healthcare, and has led workshops that have trained over 1,000 physicians and healthcare providers in strategies to reduce implicit bias.
